



ERSO Rulebook 1st August 2009 – 1st August 2011

According to the decision of the ERSO General Assembly 2009 (Hollviken, Sweden 29th July) the ERSO countries accept the FISAC – IRSF Rulebook 2010 (= World Championships & World Youth Championships & Official Judges Manual) as their Rulebook with the following modifications:

Official Judges Manual : Chapter 1 – JUDGES – Articles 2 / Section 2 -Registration of Judges

‘If a country fails to fulfill their responsibility then a 400 Euro fine for each missing judge will be imposed by ERSO on that country.’

World Championships & Youth Championships : Chapter 1 – THE COMPETITIONS – Article 2 / Section 5 - Criteria for a competition category TEAMS

‘If there are less than four (4) teams competing from a minimum of three (3) countries in a gender category in the Team Championship, then a team can receive bronze medals only if they achieve at least as many points as the bronze medalist in the next appropriate category. A team can receive silver medals only if they achieve at least as many points as the silver medalist in the next appropriate category. A team can receive gold medals only if they achieve at least as many points as the gold medalist in the next appropriate category’

World Championships & Youth Championships : Chapter 2 – GENERAL INFORMATION – Article 4 – Appeals

‘Should an unsatisfactory response be given, a written appeal is to be submitted to the Tournament Director with a deposit of 100 Euro within one (1) hour of the official results being announced, published, or handed out to all countries. He/she will then submit the written appeal to the appeal committee. The 100 Euro will only be returned if the appeal is upheld.’

In addition, the following change to the 2010 FISAC-IRSF World Youth Championship Rulebook 2010 has been agreed in September 2010 by a more than 2/3 majority Email vote of the member countries:

World Championships & Youth Championships :

Chapter 1 – THE COMPETITIONS – Article 2 / Section 6 – Age Divisions (TEAMS)

The 2011 European Youth Tournament will have only two age divisions: 12-14 and 15+. The registration regulations for the 12-14 age division will remain as described in the FISAC-IRSF Rulebook (e.g. per gender category 3 teams overall plus 2 additional teams per event).

For the 15+ Youth Tournament each country may only register a maximum of 3 teams in each gender category to compete in all 6 events of the Team Tournament. As an exception, teams may choose to compete only in the 3 Single Rope events or only in the 3 Double Dutch events.

The Double Dutch Pair Speed event (2 x 60 Sec.) will remain as a separate competition in the Youth Tournament for which each country may register a maximum of 3 teams per gender category in each of the two age divisions 12-14 and 15+.

Change from 07.03.2011 (in agreement with ERSO member countries):

~~In the Youth Tournament a maximum of one skipper from the 12-14 age division is allowed to move up one age division to compete in each 15+ age division team.~~

In the European Youth Tournament, the oldest team member determines the age division in which that team competes in all events of the competition.
